Half the liturgical year 2016 is completed after six months of extraordinary celebrations. The Incarnation mystery: Jesus' advent, nativity, epiphany. The Paschal mystery: Jesus' passion, death, resurrection, Pentecost's Holy Spirit. The solemnities of Holy Trinity and Jesus' Body and Blood. Today the Church resumes Sundays in Ordinary Time, but with a Gospel of extraordinary mercy: Jesus raises a dead man to life. Yet the one who benefits most from his extraordinary mercy is not the dead son but his widowed mother. With her husband and only son deceased, this woman's material support, in that patriarchal society, had vanished. So had her emotional support, leaving her helpless, abandoned, on society's "peripheries." One of Pope Francis' hopes in calling this Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy is to transform us into more extraordinary Christians, by making our caring outreach to just such vulnerable people, and our practical self-sacrificing love for them, our ordinary, daily, Christian way of life!

Reflexion del la Escritura de Hoy

Décimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

DIOS EN MEDIO DE NOSOTROS

En la lectura del primer libro de los Reyes, Elías visita la casa de una madre viuda cuyo hijo cae enfermo y muere. Elías invoca a Dios y la vida del hijo es restaurada y revive. La madre doliente reconoce como un hombre de Dios a Elías solo hasta que este revive a su hijo. En gálatas, Pablo falla en reconocer a Dios en su presencia aún cuando él está persiguiendo e intentando eliminar a quienes son seguidores de Cristo. Por medio de la gracia de Dios, Jesucristo se revela a Pablo, quien entonces proclama la realidad. En Lucas, otro hijo de una madre viuda muere pero Jesús siente compasión por ella y le revive al hijo. En cada ejemplo, Dios está ahí, con las madres y con Pablo, esperando que se le reconozca. A Dios solo se le reconoce, cuando en lo que es más precioso, más amado, lo más importante en la vida de cada persona se pierde y se recupera, muere y revive.

CONVIRTIENDO EL DOLOR EN UN BAILE

Estas lecturas cuentan historias muy familiares y conocidas acerca de la pérdida y la muerte. Cada una de ellas habla de una vuelta a la vida, de la vida restaurada. La muerte y la oscuridad transforman nuestra vida en formas terribles y profundas. Pero nuestra fe nos promete un amanecer, una resurrección en la que nos alegraremos. Hay un tiempo cuando nuestro luto será transformado en un baile. Estas lecturas nos recuerdan que podemos elegir el tiempo de alegría y baile porque está con nosotros ahora, aún cuando la muerte, la desesperación y la oscuridad parezcan abrumarnos. Dios está en medio de nosotros solamente si llegáramos a reconocer la luz, la alegría, el baile que está presente en nuestras vidas y en nuestro mundo. Si elegimos oscuridad, entonces no reconoceremos la presencia de Dios. Si elegimos reconocer y bailar aun cuando enfrentamos la perdida y la muerte, entonces nuestro luto será transformado. Solo así sabremos que Dios está en medio de nosotros.

Today's Scripture Reflection

June 5, 2016 — Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 Kgs 17: 17-24; Ps 30: 5-6, 11-13; Gal 1: 11-14A, 15-17, 19; Lk 7: 11-17

All of our readings on this Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time speak to an element of renewal and revival. To be resurrected we must first seek to be renewed. That is in reality what occurs in today's First Reading from the First Book of Kings and from our Gospel from St. Luke. They tell of people who were brought back to life as we know it. That is different from resurrection because in resurrection there is no death, but with life as we know it there is death.

It is resurrection which makes the difference. Jesus has indeed provided resurrection to us, although He provides life in today's Gospel. The First Reading from the First Book of Kings anticipates what occurs in today's Gospel. The Prophet Elijah finds himself in Zarephath. It is in the midst of the terrible drought which had affected the area for several years. While there, the son of a widow in the house where Elijah was residing took sick and died.

The woman knew that Elijah was a "man of God" and she appealed to him to save her son's life. As a widow the boy was the woman's only hope for she trusted that he would care for her as she aged. Elijah knew that he did not have the power to give the boy life, but he also knew that God could. He fervently prayed to God and as it says in the reading, "The Lord heard the prayer of Elijah." As is the case for all, it was Elijah's faith and the widow's faith which saved the boy. There are many things in our lives which may cause us to question or lose our faith. The point is that we must always grasp the fact that the Lord is with us; the Lord hears us; and the Lord loves us.

One of the facets of stewardship and renewal is personal witness. St. Paul provides his witness throughout his writings and consistently. Paul points out to the Galatians that they no doubt have "heard" of his dramatic conversion, how he received a revelation directly from God, not through hearing it from another human. Paul probably shared his witness everywhere he went, and what occurred in terms of his effect on the Church is truly known by all of us.

The value of personal witness, of personal testimony, is important in conversion. Not all conversions are dramatic like Paul's. Many of us have similar conversion stories, but we may think they are not as interesting as Paul's, not as likely to be an impetus for conversion in others, but that is not true. It is through sharing our faith, and giving witness to it, that others may find faith. Like Paul we are called to share and spread our faith.

In Luke's Gospel it states that Jesus was traveling to the city of Nain (not far from Nazareth) and He was accompanied by "his disciples and a large crowd." Jesus' fame and popularity was growing and He was accustomed to having these crowds, many more than just His apostles, follow Him. Imagine the scene. As Jesus and His assembly approach the gates of the city, another throng of people are coming out of the city, but it is a funeral procession. As mentioned, this parallels what Elijah sees and does in the First Reading. Jesus sees the mother of the dead boy, and His heart goes out to her.

Jesus speaks to the deceased boy as if he was alive, "Young man, I tell you, arise." As pointed out Jesus does not "resurrect" the boy, but He does provide life to him. Only God can give us life, which He has done for each of us, and only God can resurrect us in the final regard. St. Paul also says in a letter to the Romans, "God, who gives life to the dead and calls those things which do not exist as though they did." (Rom 4:17) It is this reality which provides us with hope; it is our confidence in this which gives us faith. It is this faith and hope which allow us to be witnesses to the Good News to others. Age Requirements

Children's at the age of 6 can begin their preparation for the Sacrament of First Communion.

Children at the age of 7 years old can begin their preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation if they are not baptized (RCIA for Children sesión in English Only).

Teens at the age of 13 years old or 8th grade can begin the preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Adults over 18 can begin their preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil.

All the prorgams are two year based with the exception of RCIA for adults.

Requisitos de edad

Conduct and Ethics Hotline


Those responsible for the spiritual and material goods of the Church are entrusted with the stewardship of others' gifts, and are ultimately responsible to the Lord. As a faithful steward, the Roman Catholic Diocese of San Jose is committed to maintaining the highest standards of conduct and ethics. The mission of the Church requires no less.

To this end, the Diocese of San Jose has partnered with EthicsPoint to provide a confidential method to hear suggestions, concerns or reports of financial misconduct. The EthicsPoint Hotline (1-888- 325-7863) allows parishioners, volunteers, employees, vendors and others to make confidential reports regarding the mismanagement of parish or school property, cash and all other assets. Reportable are also issues of apparent disregard of policies pertaining to the proper management of these assets. Suspected unethical behavior by employees, volunteers, staff, trustees, officers, directors, agents or contractors of the Diocese should also be made to EthicsPoint. All reports may be made anonymously.

It is the hope of the Diocese that EthicsPoint will assist in the protection of all who interact with the parishes, schools, chancery and other diocesan agencies.

EthicsPoint accepts reports of financial misconduct through its website or its Hotline: 1 - 888-325-7863. A complete report will be made to diocesan leadership, so that leadership may review and provide feedback and resolution for the issues that are reported.

Energize Your Body with Biking:

Biking is a form of aerobic physical activity, which can help to increase your chances of living longer, decrease your risk of many serious health problems, help you stay or get to a healthy weight, and decrease your chances of becoming depressed.

It also strengthens bones, muscles and joints, reduced arthritis and disability, improves mental health and mood, and prevents falls in older adults. It is also a lot of fun!

Adults need at least 30 minutes daily of moderate to vigorous physical activity. Children and teens need at least 60 minutes.

Here are some tips for getting started with biking:

- Use your bike as a form of transportation, as well as for fun.
- Always wear a helmet and bright clothing.
- Be sure your bike is in good working condition, check tires, brakes, chain, and other moving parts.


