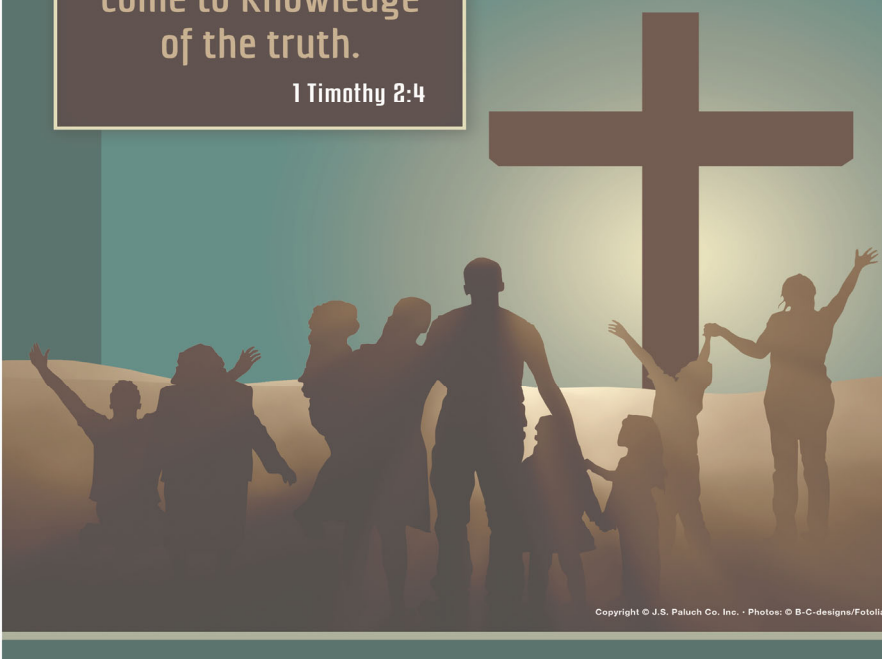

In Jesus' parable of the Unjust Steward, we encounter a financial manager who has wasted his master's wealth and faces dismissal from his position. To overcome the crisis confronting him, the steward reduces some very considerable debts owed by poor neighbors to his master in order to help them out. Though the steward has sinned against God and his master by squandering what belongs to someone else, both the prudent way in which he goes about resolving the crisis coupled with relieving people who are in need can be seen as a way to better steward the gifts entrusted to us by God. Although good stewards today acknowledge that they may never use their God-given gifts in a way that completely conforms to the demands of the Gospel, a commitment to using their gifts with prudence and for the purpose of helping their neighbors wins God's favor. ## Today's Scripture Reflection

Although we may not immediately perceive them, Holy Scripture is filled with references to stewardship and what it means. Today's Gospel from St. Luke that includes the Parable of the Dishonest Steward is more pointed and direct than many of those references.

Retired Bishop Robert Morneau — who was instrumental in the development of the United States Bishops' pastoral letter, *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response*, and has been a popular presenter on stewardship for decades — is fond of saying that on Judgment Day, the Lord will only ask us one question, "What have you done with the garden I have given you?" In other words, we are all gifted, perhaps in different ways, but whatever gifts we receive might be considered our garden from God. We must account for those gifts.

The whole concept of stewardship is clear in today's parable. The steward is the manager (not the owner) of the master's gifts. God is, of course, the manager, and we are the stewards who are charged with the responsibility of overseeing our gifts of time, talent, treasure, and perhaps even influence. Do we use those gifts wisely and with justice?

That is the point we must get from this Gospel. Our Holy Father Pope Francis understood the significance of being a steward when he recently said, "In the end, everything has been entrusted to our protection, and all of us are responsible for it. Be protectors of God's gifts." As the Lord says to the steward in today's Gospel, "The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones."

## World Youth Day 2016

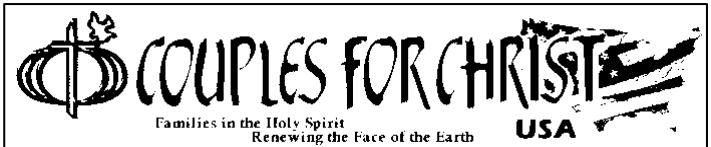
Esta es la juventud del Papa! The resounding cheers still ring in our ears from World Youth Day 2016, where Kraków, Poland welcomed over 3 million Catholic youths of all ages.

Walking through the cobbled streets of Kraków, the hometown of Pope St. John Paul II, we saw brightly-clad crowds shining with cheeriness and excitement on an overcast day, the buses and trains almost spilling over with travelers from far and wide. Everywhere we looked we saw groups of youth, big and small, praying, chanting, marching, singing songs that were obviously well-loved in different languages. Walking into a square, we found a giant statue literally crawling with youths waving their respective flags, shouting their hearts out in rallying cheers. "Where are you from?" was enough to trigger friendly conversation with strangers and exchange little trinkets or bits of knowledge about a famous saint from their home country. These gifts ranged from small flags to pins to packets of seeds to hand-woven bracelets. We even danced in impromptu rallies, strangers brought together by our common faith.

We trekked through crowds to the side of the road where we knew the Holy Father would pass on his way to the welcoming ceremony. As people passed, a simple shout of every country whose flag we recognized prompted an enthusiastic cheer in response. After hours of waiting in sprinkling rain, the weather seemed to pause; security tightened, and we sensed a heightened anticipation. Phones at the ready to record the glimpses we could catch of the Holy Father on his white Popemobile, we almost missed the moment when a tram drove past with LED signs flashing "TRAM DEL PAPA." Screams involuntarily erupted as we gathered our wits enough to press "record," capturing the image of a figure dressed in white, smiling and waving through the window. We did it. We saw the Pope.

Celebrity fangirling moment aside, at the actual ceremony, we saw representatives of every country and culture share the stage to welcome Pope Francis. A video played featuring young saints from all over the world, who were also represented on stage by actual youths from those countries. Perhaps it was the unabashed display of faith and love that we witnessed in everyone we met that day, or maybe the image of our Pope smiling fondly at the crowds of pilgrims from all over the world; for whatever reason, we felt an overwhelming sense of peace and sheer togetherness, and more than a few tears were shed that day.

It was truly a blessed and humbling experience to be able to sing, dance, and pray through the rain, heat, and language barriers with all the beautiful faces from every corner of the world, brought together by our faith. I wrote about meeting youths and glimpsing the Pope, but I feel that what we truly found was a reflection of Jesus. To be able to witness Him, especially in our youth, is so heart-warming and inspiring. We hope to bring the spirit from this celebration back home to our own friends and family here at MHT. ### Pastoral Council “to guide”

With our PAR Leadership now heading into its 2<sup>nd</sup> year, our Commissions and Council have been working on the next steps of our PAR Leadership by first opening the opportunity for new members to be selected to one of our five commissions; Worship, Community, Outreach, Administration and Formation, taking the place of those members that have fulfilled their terms. In June we held our first annual Gathering of Ministers to begin the selection of new members and then presented the new members at our August Leadership Night meeting.

As we move forward in setting new goals and objectives to better serve our parish community in all aspects of parish life, our Council discussed ways of improving our leadership structure and the engagement of our members. We asked for feedback from past commissions members about their experience via an online survey. Their input is essential and will be thoughtfully considered as we proceed with a common goal for unity and service for our Most Holy Trinity Parish and School.

### Administration “to give”

### Build a Healthy Plate

Before you eat, think about what goes on your plate or in your cup or bowl. Foods like vegetables, fruits, whole grains, low-fat dairy products, and lean protein foods contain the nutrients you need without too many calories.

- Make half your plate fruits and vegetables
- Eat fruit, vegetable, or unsalted nuts as snacks
- Switch to skim or 1% milk or fat-free yogurt
- Make at least half your grains whole
- Choose 100% whole grain cereals, breads, crackers, rice and pasta
- Keep meat and poultry portions small and lean. Twice a week, make seafood the protein on your plate.
- Eat beans, which are natural source of fiber and protein
