Today's Scripture Reflection

Today's readings are filled with predictions and warnings. In particular the Gospel from Luke that quotes Jesus about what we might expect if we truly strive to be His disciples and good stewards of His Word. Jesus says, "... they will seize and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name."

That all sounds grand and dramatic, but the truth is that Jesus is warning us of something far more subtle. If we truly strive and try to be the Lord's disciples, we may well be persecuted not only by secular forces, but also by religious forces. The Lord's point is that we must be prepared to endure and be patient.

The Gospel closes with Jesus saying, "By your perseverance you will secure your lives." The whole idea of endurance and patience is a common theme for Jesus (and for St. Paul in his many letters as well). In the Gospel the original Greek word that we translate into "perseverance" is *hupomone*. The meaning of this word is not passive, not a patient waiting so to speak. We endure because of the promises of Christ.

It is these "promises" that give us the strength and hope to practice stewardship, to be good stewards. St. Teresa of Calcutta said, "Without patience we will learn less in life. We will feel less. We will hear less. Ironically, rush and more usually mean less."

Trigésimo Tercer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Al ir concluyendo este Año Jubilar de la Misericordia, los primeros discípulos de Jesús preguntan lo que en cada época parece preguntarse acerca del fin del mundo: "Maestro, ¿cuándo va a ser eso?" (Lucas 21:7). Pero en lugar de lo que nos gustaría saber, Jesús nos dice lo que necesitamos conocer. No se preocupen por desastres naturales, la violencia de las personas, el sufrimiento humano. Debido a la abundante misericordia de Dios, todo es gracia. "Esto les servirá para dar testimonio de mí" (21:13). El profeta Malaquías promete que "brillará el sol de justicia, que les traerá la salvación en sus rayos" (Malaquías 3:20a) y, Jesús describe cómo debemos recibir el fin "Levántense, alcen la cabeza; se acerca su liberación" (21:28). En lugar de estarnos preocupando por nosotros mismos y los riesgos del futuro, tanto el Evangelio de Jesús como el Año Jubilar de la Misericordia convocado por el Papa Francisco nos invitan a avanzar pasando nuestra vida proclamando la promesa de la abundante misericordia de Dios e interpretándola en obras vivas de compasión inagotable y consolación renovada.

In Luke 14:12-14 - "When you give a dinner or a supper, do not as your friends, your brothers, your relatives, nor rich neighbors, lest they also invite you back, and you be repaid. But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind. And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you; for you shall be repaid at the resurrection of the just."

Homeless Shelter Program

Most Holy Trinity Church and St. Vincent de Paul will be partnering with St. Francis of Assisi to host the Men's Homeless Shelter. The shelter will open January 2, 2017 and end April 9, 2017. Most Holy Trinity and St. Francis of Assisi will shelter 15 guests on a rotation basis. We are asking for volunteers to share their Talents, Time and Treasures to helping with our shelter needs. We will be announcing our need for volunteers after each mass beginning on Saturday, November 12 and Sunday, November 13. After each mass there will be a sign-up table in the plaza. Health Ministry

You can lower your risk of breast cancer by changing those risk factors that can be changed. Both increased body weight and weight gain as an adult are linked with a higher risk of breast cancer after menopause. Alcohol also increases risk of breast cancer. Even low levels of alcohol intake have been linked with an increase in risk. A diet that's rich in vegetables, fruit, poultry, fish, and low-fat dairy products has also been linked with a lower risk of breast cancer in some studies.

At this time, the best advice about diet and activity to possibly reduce the risk of breast cancer is to:

- Get regular, intentional physical activity. At least 30 minutes 5x a week.
- Reduce your lifetime weight gain by limiting your calories and getting regular physical activity.
- Avoid or limit your alcohol intake.

Usted puede disminuir su riesgo de cáncer del seno, cambiando los factores de riesgo que se pueden cambiar. Tanto el aumento de peso y el peso en la edad adulta están relacionados con un mayor riesgo de cáncer del seno después de la menopausia. El alcohol también aumenta el riesgo de cáncer de mama. Incluso niveles bajos de consumo de alcohol se han relacionado con un aumento en el riesgo. Una dieta rica en verduras, frutas, carne de ave, pescado y productos lácteos bajos en grasa también se ha relacionado con un menor riesgo de cáncer del seno en algunos estudios.

En este momento, el mejor consejo sobre la dieta y la actividad para reducir el riesgo de cáncer es el siguiente:

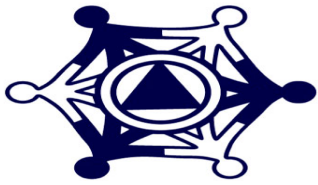
