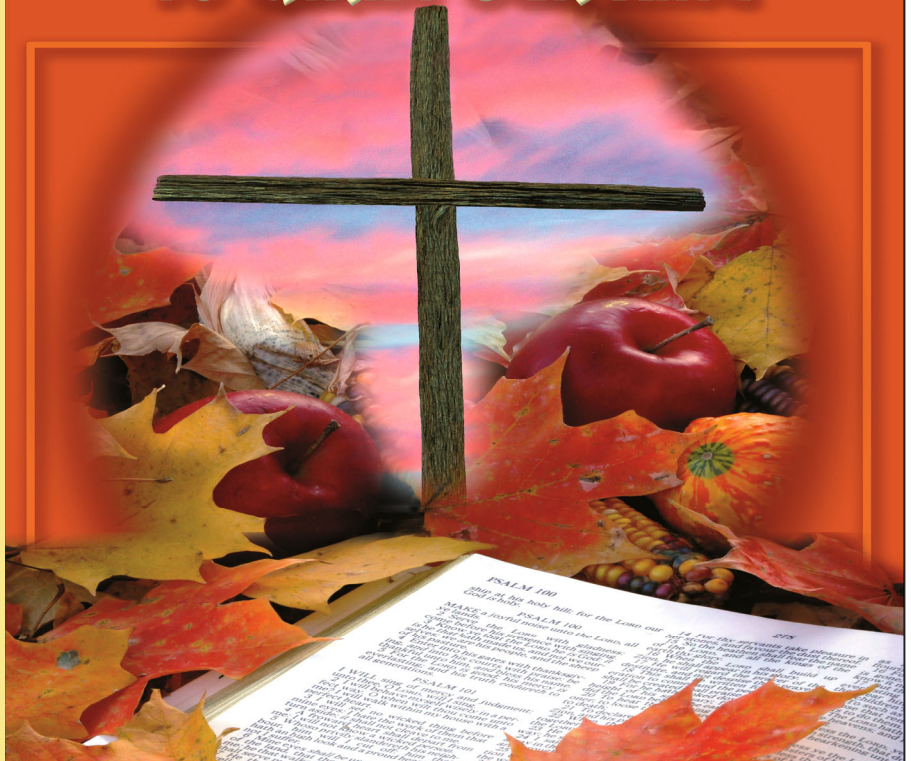

Reflexion del la Escritura de Hoy

Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo REY DE MISERICORDIA

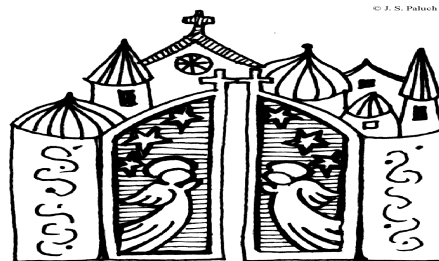
Hoy es el último día del Año Jubilar de la Misericordia, el que empezó el 8 de diciembre de 2015. Ahora es el tiempo perfecto para reflexionar acerca de este año. ¿Cómo estuvo el Año de la Misericordia? ¿De qué manera el perdón de Dios nos sorprendió y nos fortaleció? ¿De que maneras el ejemplo de Jesús iluminó nuestros corazones y acciones? El Evangelio de hoy puede guiar nuestra reflexión.

- Jesús muere agonizante en la cruz. ¿Qué dolor hemos sufrido por los demás?
- Personas de todo tipo se burlan de Jesús, haciendo gestos. ¿Hemos sufrido a causa del odio o la deshonra?
- Manteniendo sus ojos en el Paraíso, Jesús perdona a sus ejecutores. ¿He perdonado a otras personas, aún cuando ellas no se disculparon o disculparán?
- Jesús usa su último aliento para confortar a otro hombre moribundo. ¿Nos preocupamos por atender las necesidades de los demás, aún cuando no es nuestra obligación?

EXAMEN DE LA NOCHE

Este tipo de examen nos ayuda no solamente al término del Año de la Misericordia, sino también al término de cada día. Cuando san Ignacio de Loyola empezaba su examen de la noche, él siempre empezaba agradeciendo, reconociendo que Dios proveyó cada don durante el día. Si hemos tenido un día especialmente difícil, podría buscar ánimo en san Pablo. Sus palabras a los colosenses nos recuerda que toda la plenitud "habitara" en Cristo, quien murió para reconciliar con Dios y abrir las puertas del Paraíso. ¡Verdaderamente, siempre podemos dar gracias por eso!

Con corazones agradecidos, luego, seguimos con nuestro examen de la noche. ¿Cómo cooperamos con Dios como hijos e hijas del Reino de Dios? ¿Cómo llevamos a otros hoy algo de ese Paraíso? ¿Cómo nos ponemos en el camino de Dios, haciéndonos obstáculos para el camino de otros hacia el Paraíso? Pidiendo al Señor que tenga misericordia en nuestra debilidad, damos gracias cordiales por permitirnos trabajar por el Reino. ¡Toda alabanza a Cristo, el Rey!

Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom

Today's Scripture Reflection

Today is The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (more commonly called Christ the King). Clearly the readings all relate to Christ as the King, not just on earth, but throughout the entire universe.

The First Reading from Second Samuel 5 speaks of the kingship of David. The Books of Samuel comprise part of a theological history of the Israelites. This particular passage, although not lengthy, tells how all the tribes turned to and recognized David as their King. It is worth noting that this was a second choice for most of the tribes. They had previously recognized Ishbosheth, who was a son of Saul. That idea of recognizing others first is paralleled in many ways by how we may look at Jesus. Is He truly our King, absolutely the center of our lives, or do we merely turn to Him when it seems that is our last resort? Jesus should be our first choice always. That is our call.

St. Paul in his letter to the Colossians, our Second Reading, tells us in effect that God has "transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins." This "transfer" means that everything we have and everything we are belongs to the Lord. How often do we hear similar language when we talk about the idea of stewardship? It all begins with us recognizing that all comes from God, and we are merely caretakers, or stewards, of these gifts while on earth.

This God-centered attitude produces many effects on us, including recognizing Jesus as our Lord, our Savior, and our King. However, Paul also makes it clear that part of our response must be "Let us give thanks to the Father." Placing God at the center of our lives and understanding that we need to lead lives of gratitude are exactly how we recognize and honor Christ as our King.

Our Gospel Reading from St. Luke comes from within the Passion of Christ, from Luke 23, which is a narration of Christ's Crucifixion. In this passage it asserts "Above him (Jesus on the Cross) was an inscription that read, 'This is the King of the Jews.'" We note often on crucifixes a small sign above the Lord with the letters INRI. That represents the Latin phrase *Jesus Nazarenus, Rex Iudaeorum*, which means Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews. Of course, it was placed there mockingly, evidently by the Roman soldiers, but it has become representative of the reality for us.

Two years ago on this Solemnity of Christ the King, in his homily at the Mass at St. Peter Basilica, Pope Francis said, "Jesus' Kingdom requires us to imitate Jesus' works of mercy through which He brought about His Kingdom. Jesus has opened to us His Kingdom. But it is for us to enter into it, beginning with our life now, by being close to our sisters and brothers in need. If we truly love them, we will be willing to share with them what should be most precious to us, Jesus Himself, His Gospel, and His place as our King."

Today also marks the official close of our Holy Year of Mercy. Jesus has called us to follow Him, and to embrace discipleship and stewardship as a way of life. That is in large part what Pope Francis has called us to in this Year of Mercy. Have we done anything to fulfill either of those calls? It is not too late; Jesus made it clear to us many times that it is never too late. Even as He was dying on the Cross, He turned to the converted criminal next to Him and said, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." May we strive to live in such a way that we hear the same thing. **Filed Under: Homily Guides, Stewardship Reflections on Lectionary Readings (CSCI)**

Be a Good Steward of Thanksgiving Day

Your Thanksgiving Day can be more than just enjoying a great meal and turning on the television to search for the traditional parades and football games. How about expressing your stewardship of this day in a more meaningful way? Here are some suggestions for making Thanksgiving an opportunity for expressing our gratitude to the Lord in creative ways:

- **Go to Mass and count your blessings.** Start the day off on a positive note and celebrate the Eucharist. In your prayer reflect on five things you are most grateful for in your life. Then reflect on how you can be an even better steward of these gifts.
- Write “I’m thankful for you” cards and give them out or e-mail them on Thanksgiving (or mail them beforehand).
- **Share your Thanksgiving meal with someone who is alone this Thanksgiving.** Look for someone, such as a neighbor, co-worker, fellow parishioner, college student or armed services personnel who may be separated from family and ask them to join in your Thanksgiving dinner.
- **Practice ecumenism!** Many parishes make Thanksgiving an opportune time to join in ecumenical services with other Christian worshipping communities, or inter-faith activities and programs with non-Christian centers of worship. Find one nearby and experience something new and enriching.
- **Visit the sick.** Check with hospitals, assisted living facilities or nursing homes in the area to see if there are volunteer opportunities to visit with patients or residents on that day.
- **Help someone if you can.** Extend your generosity and blessings beyond your own family. Be part of an adopt-a-family effort, help distribute food baskets, or bring canned foods or clothing to St. Vincent de Paul centers.
- **Volunteer your time** at a soup kitchen to help prepare and serve Thanksgiving dinners to others.
- **Take a walk.** Find a place to enjoy God's gift of creation. Head out the door for a refreshing walk. Invite family, friends or others to share the experience too.
- **Most important!** Take advantage of the Thanksgiving holidays to focus on what you're grateful for and the things you appreciate about yourself and others. It is an ideal time to remember and to celebrate the many blessings in our lives.

Make Healthier Holiday Choices

As you celebrate, think of little changes you can make this holiday season to create healthier meals and active days.

Enjoy all the food groups at your celebration – use whole grain crackers, use low fat milk instead of heavy cream. Share healthier options during your holiday meal.

Make sure your protein is lean

Turkey, roast beef, fresh ham, beans, fish. When serving meats, trim away any fat before cooking.

Bake healthier – Use recipes with unsweetened applesauce or mashed ripe bananas instead of butter. Try cutting the amount of sugar listed in recipes in half.

Cheers to good health – Quench your thirst with low-calorie options. Drink water with lemon or lime slices. Offer seltzer water with a splash of 100% fruit juice.

Make exercise a part of the fun – Make being active part of your holiday tradition. Have fun walking and talking with family and friends after a holiday meal. Give gifts that encourage other to practice healthy habits.

Enjoy leftovers – create delicious new meals with your leftovers. Add turkey to soups or salads. Use extra veggies in omelets, sandwiches or stews.

Give to others – Spend time providing foods or preparing meals for those who may need a little help. Give food to a local food bank or volunteer to serve meals during the holiday season.

Haga que el ejercicio sea parte de la diversión - Diviértase caminando y hablando con la familia y amigos después de la cena. Da regalos que animan a otros a practicar hábitos saludables.

Aproveche de las sobras –prepare platos con las sobras del día anterior. Agregue el pavo a las sopas o ensaladas. Use verduras extra en tortas de huevo, sándwiches o guisos.

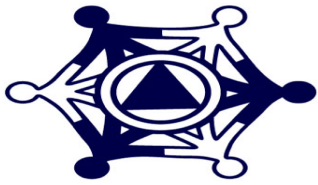
